- 1. Please bring a list of all medications you take, prescription and over the counter.
- 2. Please bring a list of any medication allergies you have.

LESS THAN 1 YEAR OLD:

- 1. Nothing by mouth 4 hours prior to the exam
- 2. No solid foods the day of the exam

1 TO 3 YEARS OLD

DAY PRIOR TO EXAM:

- 1. Clear liquid* diet 24 hours prior to the exam.
- 2. Take 1.5 oz. Magnesium Citrate at 4p.m. the afternoon before the exam.
- 3. Take 1.5 oz. Magnesium Citrate at bedtime the night before the exam.

DAY OF EXAM:

1. Nothing by mouth 4 hours prior to the exam.

4 TO 17 YEARS OLD

2 DAYS PRIOR TO EXAM:

1. Low residue diet** for 2 days prior to the exam.

DAY PRIOR TO EXAM:

- 1. Clear liquid diet* for 24 hours prior to exam.
- 2. Castor Oil in grape juice or root beer at 4:00p.m. the afternoon before the exam in the following doses:
 - a. Ages 4-5: Take 1 oz.
 - b. Ages 6-9: Take 1.5 oz.
 - c. Ages 10-17: Take 2 oz.
- 3. Administer a pediatric Fleets Enema at 8:00 p.m. the night before the exam.

DAY OF EXAM

1. Clear liquid diet*

*CLEAR LIQUIDS- includes pop, apple and other clear juices, plain Jell-O, water, tea & coffee (sugar is ok, no cream, milk, or dairy substitutes).

LOW RESIDUE DIET- includes noodles, rice, ripe bananas, saltine crackers, and Melba toast, **NO MILK, POTATOES or **VEGETABLES.**

SPECIAL SITUATIONS:

FEMALE PATIENTS: If you are pregnant and this was **NOT** mentioned at the time of scheduling; please call the Imaging Department (574) 364-2711, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

PROCEDURE INFORMATION: Your child will be given a Barium Enema while x-ray images are taken.

***Please check with your Insurance Company regarding specific Insurance Pre-Certification requirements. Many Commercial Insurance Companies require Pre-Certification for outpatient procedures.
